**Kaddish is a Mitzvah, a true act of kindness, and one of the basic cornerstones of Jewish life. It has the power to lift the soul from one spiritual world to the next, even higher, every year**

**Many people wish to say Kaddish for their loved ones, but for various reasons, find it difficult or even impossible. We are one people with one soul. Hence, Torah law teaches that when needed, one Jew can say Kaddish on behalf of any other.**

**What is it that we can give to a loved one who is no longer physically amongst us? The answer is a great deal. We can give them life.**

**This is the main idea behind the recital of the Kaddish in merit of a departed soul.**

**While Kaddish is commonly known as the “mourners prayer”, a reading of the text reveals that it is not about death or mourning, but the public proclamation of G-d’s greatness.**

**By rising from the depths of anguish and loss to offer praise to G-d, we transform the event of death into an act of life.**

**We offer the following unique services:**

- **Kaddish recited every day for eleven months (full requirement) following the death of a relative, loved one or friend.**
- **The study of the Mishnah (the Oral Law interpreting the Torah) for a full year, with the name of the departed mentioned before the learning.**

- The annual observance of the Yahrzeit (the Hebrew anniversary of the departed), which includes recitation of the Kaddish and Torah learning.
- Reciting Yizkor (special prayer on behalf of the departed one) on the holy Yom Kippur and Holidays.

*In memorium of our dear Jewish brethren who perished in the Holocaust, we say Kaddish, which has in it the power to keep those precious souls alive, and link us to them in a most appropriate manner.*

Throughout the millennium, Jews have remembered their loved ones with the recitation of the Kaddish.

- Kaddish is the way we actively demonstrate that a Jewish soul is never forgotten.
